

Application and Selection Process 2018

1. Applications for NZ Commonwealth Scholarships will open on **1 February 2018**.
2. The application form will be available to be downloaded and printed from the MFAT website from **1 February 2018**: www.mfat.govt.nz/en/aid-and-development/scholarships/types-of-scholarships/

Nominating agencies are welcome to print and distribute applications.
3. Applications must be sent by candidates directly to the nominating agency by **28 March 2018**. Applications sent directly to MFAT (not via the nominating agency) will be declined.
4. Nominating agencies should review eligible applications and select the **two** preferred applicants that best align to MFAT preference factors, priority sectors and the eligibility criteria.
5. The two nominated applications must be received by MFAT to the below address by **4 May, 2018**:

6. MFAT will be in direct contact with applicants on the outcome of their application. Preferred applicants will be notified by **12 October, 2018**. Nominating agencies will be notified of the final result.

Eligibility, preference factors and priority sectors

The New Zealand Commonwealth Scholarships are prestigious scholarships for people from developing countries to study in New Zealand. This scholarship is intended to foster and build potential leaders, as well as equipping individuals with skills and knowledge to benefit their home country.

We look for scholars with good academic ability and leadership skills, as well as assessing how their study can improve development in their country. Following in-country nomination, potential scholars will be further assessed by a rigorous selection process, including online screening and interviews.

Nominating agencies should select the two applications for nomination that best meet the following eligibility conditions, preference factors and priority sector alignment set out below:

Eligibility: Applicants must meet all the eligibility criteria and the conditions set out by MFAT. Any additional requirements set out by nominating agencies are not permitted. Please refer to Appendix A for further information.

Preference factors:

- Applicants who demonstrate strong academic ability, leadership qualities, and a commitment to the development of their home country
- Applicants who are 39 years of age or younger at the time of commencing their scholarship
- Applicants who apply to study in areas relating to one or more of their country's priority sectors
- Gender balance will also be a consideration in final selection decisions.

Priority sectors: Our priority sectors are areas that will support the resiliency and growth of your country. We aim to strengthen priority sectors by supporting scholars through funding, training and alumni relations. MFAT priority sectors also align to areas where New Zealand has specialist expertise. For example, we are known for our innovation in many areas such as agriculture, renewable energy, disaster risk management, public sector management, and business.

In order to best meet the human resource needs identified by the New Zealand Aid Programme, each nominated applicant's choice of study must directly align to the priority sectors for their country and region. Please refer to appendix B for further information relevant to your country.

Priority sector study options:

Priority sector study options vary across countries and regions, the below list is a guide of the types of study options that may be available for each priority sector. Please refer to the relevant scholarship country/region pages on our website for more exact information.

Agriculture development

- Agri-business management: Agricultural economics, agricultural systems and management, rural development, logistics, supply chain and distribution management, value chain development, agriculture marketing, international agribusiness
- Agriculture and primary industry production: animal science, veterinary nursing, plant science, horticultural science, soil science, forestry, agricultural pest management
- Agriculture trade and technology: Phytosanitary, bio-security, biotechnology, agricultural trade
- Post-harvest: Food production, food sciences/technology, post-harvest processing, food storage and packaging, food safety
- Marine conservation, land rehabilitation, waste management
- Veterinary technology (undergraduate)
- Public policy, administration, finance, or governance directly related to one of the above areas

Disaster risk management

- Disaster preparedness and response, emergency management

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Appendix A: New Zealand Commonwealth Scholarships Eligibility Criteria

Applicants from all eligible countries must meet the following conditions to be eligible for a New Zealand Scholarship:

- I will be at least 18 years old at the time I start the scholarship.
- I am a citizen of a participating country (as listed above) and I am residing in and applying for a scholarship from my country of citizenship.
- I confirm that I am not also a citizen or permanent resident of any the following countries: New Zealand, Australia, Israel, South Korea, Japan, USA, any European Union country, Qatar, United Kingdom, Canada, Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates. (Note: This criteria does not apply to people from Niue, Cook Islands and Tokelau who are New Zealand citizens, and it also does not apply to NZ-Samoan dual citizens.)
- On 31 December 2018, my country will have been my main country of residence for the last two years or more (unless you are a member of the diplomatic corps or a dependent of a member of the diplomatic corps).
- I confirm that I am not currently serving in the military.
- I expect to meet immigration requirements for a student visa to New Zealand or the Pacific Island country I will study in (i.e. medical checks, etc.). Check the following websites for further information:

- I expect to meet the academic entry requirements (including English language ability) for my preferred programme of study and institution. Refer to the website of your preferred institution to confirm entry requirements.
- I confirm that I have not previously had a New Zealand Scholarship terminated because of poor academic performance (within the past 5 years) or breach of scholarship contract.
- I intend to return to my country for two years or more at the end of my scholarship to contribute to my country's development.
- I have at least one year full-time (two year's part-time) work experience relevant to my career and/or preferred qualification unless I am applying straight from secondary school or during my first year of tertiary study (for countries offered undergraduate study).

(Part-time work is defined as up to 29 hours per week, Full-time work is defined as 30 plus hours per week).

In addition to the above criteria, Commonwealth applicants must be intending to do a Master's degree or a PhD, Commonwealth scholarships are not available for undergraduate study.
